EXAMPLE TO FOLLOW FROM ROMANIA:

"Good news for students: The government plans to offer them free of charge on their metro journey, not just to the train."

Ministers and officials attended a meeting with students' representatives to discuss the rules for the application of free of charge for students in railway transport. "Following the adoption of GEO no.2/2017 which grants the students this facility, the parties involved have agreed a series of specifications on the content of the application rules," the press release said.

According to the cited source, the free of charge for the internal railway transport is granted to all students enrolled in the form of education with frequency, in a higher education institution accredited from Romania: state or private; to study programs from all three cycles: license, master, doctorate; regardless of the form of study funding (budget/fee); regardless of age and nationality; for an unlimited number of trips, including during university holidays; irrespective of the railway operator.



There has been a recent debate about the unification of the European Union. The Romanian government recently gave the opportunity for students to travel around Europe without any charges. In our goal to make Europe work as a whole, we suggest that we follow their example. Every country is unique in its own way and different things make it 'the best' one.

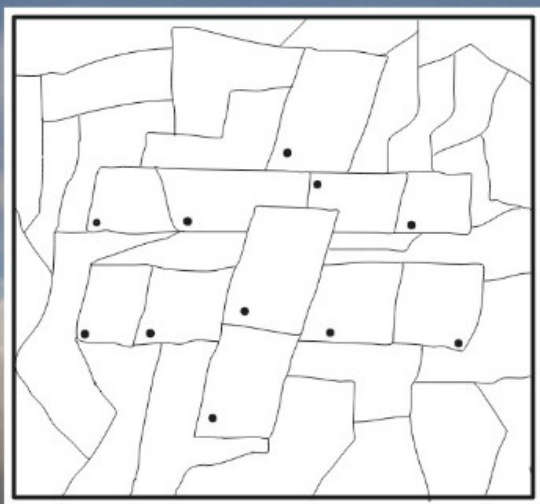
