Milena: Hello, so nice to meet you, thank you for your time.

Sofia F.: Hello, thanks for inviting me, it's a pleasure...

4 SECRETS OF A PERFECT CV

1. CV is not a job interview ticket, but a banknote.

The main task of the CV is to show the true value of you as a professional. If you did not immediately show your true value, then in an interview it will be more difficult to do. The recruiter is interested in making the CV look as expensive as possible. If the recruiter works for the agency, his income depends on the income of the candidates he finds for customer vacancies.

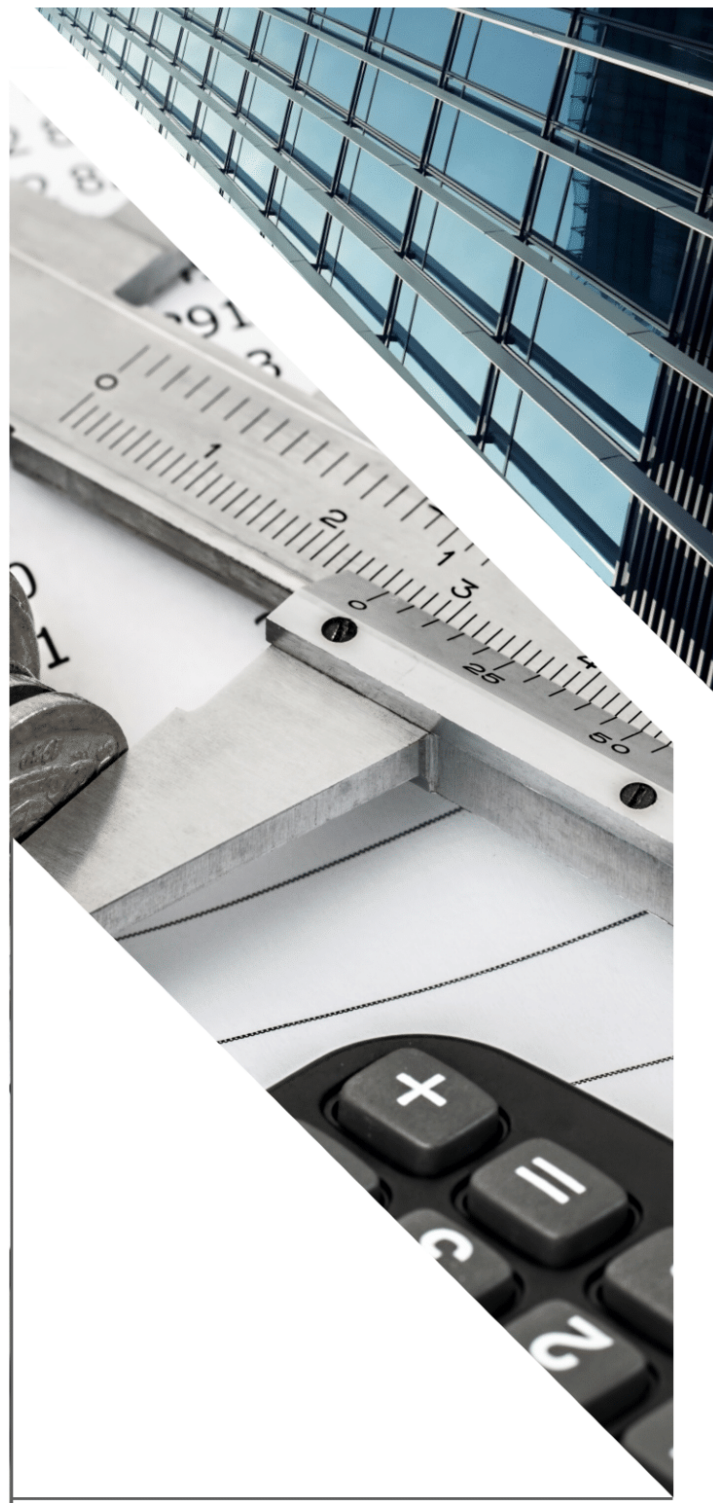
2. Customize the CV for your profession.

There are no universal CVs for all professions. For each profession, different types of CVs are important. The task of each type of it is to show what is most important for the profession. So, for example, it is important for sales professions to show how you made money for the company.

3. Show the recruiter your success.

Your CV is not a set of separate blocks about your work, education and training. A million-worth CV is a such that is built into a success story. What is a success story? This is when it is clear how your education, career path, all kinds of trainings and certificates, personal qualities and the position you are looking for are related. If there is no logic in these elements, the recruiter will skip your CV.

4. Keep the ideal CV size. I believe that the ideal resume size is strictly two pages. One is too small, this is only permissible for students, and three are already too many. If everything is clear with one page – such a resume looks like a resume of a junior specialist – then with three, four, and so on pages, everything is not so obvious. And the answer is simple: the recruiter will only look at two pages in 80% of cases.

1. Study abroad with Erasmus+

Erasmus+ can offer you support during your period of study abroad: whether this is in an Erasmus+ Programme country or in a Partner country.

2. Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees

With Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees, you can receive a full degree scholarship for a Master-level international study programme. Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees are distinguished by their academic excellence and the high level of integration of the courses between multiple higher education institutions across countries.

3. Youth Exchanges

Youth exchanges allow groups of young people from different countries to meet, live together and work on shared projects for short periods.

Youth exchanges take place outside the school environment. On a youth exchange, you can expect to participate in activities such as workshops, exercises, debates, role-plays, outdoor activities and more.

4. Teach abroad with Erasmus+

With Erasmus+, opportunities are available to spend time teaching at an education institution abroad.

These opportunities are available to both staff working in the education sector and to individuals in businesses invited to share their knowledge of a given sector, subject or issue to students.

Opportunities to teach abroad with Erasmus+ are available in education institutions operating at all levels.

5. Traineeships with Erasmus+

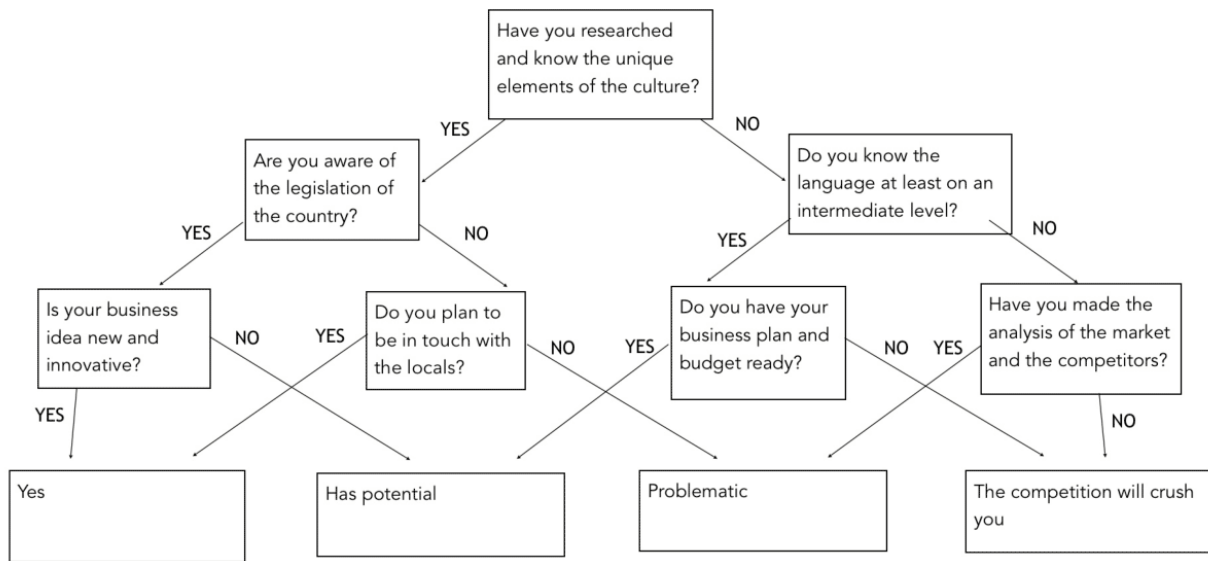
Erasmus+ supports traineeships (work placements, internships, etc.) abroad for students enrolled in higher education in a Programme Country. These opportunities are also open to recent graduates. are recognised through a Youthpass.

In this article, only a small part of the exchange opportunities was mentioned and only for individual, even though EU offers opportunities for organisations as well. Erasmus+ has opportunities for people of all ages, helping them develop and share knowledge and experience at institutions and organisations in different countries.

Set to last until 2020, Erasmus+ doesn't just have opportunities for students. Merging seven prior programmes, it has opportunities for a wide variety of individuals and organisations.
