Thus, there is the mass disillusionment that suddenly characterizes this generation, the one that gives life to 30-year-olds who cannot leave their homes, depressed and without any prospects. People who at 27/28 years seem to have failed and do not want to start over. "If it doesn't work when you follow the instructions, maybe it can't work ... maybe the person is the problem", this is what many young people think of themselves.
